- For use up to 24 hours. Prolonged stabilisation on a long board with headblocks might lead to pressure at the occiput leading to pain and skin damage

Instructions for Use


- 1. Tear open packaging at perforation site.
- 2. Remove head blocks, base plate and tape.
- 3. Place base plate on the orthopaedic stretcher/extrication board and position patient's head appropriately. Move blocks against the head and the block openings to the patient's ears.
- 4. Pull the tape over the head blocks while centring on the patient's forehead and secure to the back of the orthopaedic stretcher/ extrication board on the other side. Repeat for the patient's chin area.
